



## ANNOUNCING THE BOOK RELEASE OF FOUR STARS IN THE WINDOW



*Four Stars in the Window* is the gripping, patriotic tale of four American brothers who faced the immense perils of WWII. The book's cover contains an image of a flag. That flag hung in the window of the brothers' parents (Harry and Eva Powell), West Hartford, Connecticut home. Each star on such a flag was stitched in to honor a father, brother or son who had gone to serve his country. The four stars on this flag conveyed that four Powell brothers (David, Kenneth, Delmar, and Roger) had all gone to fight.

*Four Stars in the Window* recounts each brother's journey. After being forced to jump from a flak-crippled, burning B-17 and serving 9 months as a POW, after fighting in the battle of Iwo Jima, facing the bloody chaos of Omaha Beach on D-Day, evading German U-boats on the foggy Atlantic waters, swimming during a hurricane and much more, the Powell brothers survived, by the grace of God. Written by Tom Delvaux, author of *Tiger Joe: A Photographic Diary of a WWII Reconnaissance Pilot*, whose precision and style blends fast-paced adventures with in-depth facts about places, ships, planes and weaponry. The book is complemented with a number of contextual photographs, personal papers and a complete transcription of President Roosevelt's prayer that was given over the radio to his war-weary country.

The life of freedom in America has come with great cost and sacrifice. The pages of American history are laden with the names of those who have given their lives to gain and preserve this precious gift. The sacrifice of the men who fought in WWII is one we can never forget and must continue to honor. They left behind girlfriends or wives, promising careers, educations and loving families that were familiar and stable. These young men traded in their youthful exuberance for rifles, bayonets, flak jackets... all the tools of battle and were transformed from mere boys to warriors who were willing to fight the Axis powers, despotic aggressors that threatened all who opposed them.

*Four Stars in the Window*, a 180 page, 7x10 cloth hardback book, complete with a beautiful dust jacket, is the culmination of the Powell brothers' war stories. Their legacy is secured by the fact that generations to come will hear the echoes of heroes' voices in this work, heroes who fought against forces of darkness and prevailed.
